

- 3. Turn right onto Lyons Falls Rd. (2.9mi)
- 4. Continue on Lyons Falls Rd. (1.3mi)

As part of the county's effort to improve access to the Black river for canoeing and fishing, the lower Lyons Falls boat launch was constructed in June of 1994. Take the chance here to view the falls, the foliage, and the old mill!

Agers Falls

Located on the Moose River this area has been recognized by generations of visitors for its natural beauty.

Relax at the picnic area and take in the beautiful waterfalls and fall foliage together!

There is also a 1mile Moose River Trail at the falls with ample opportunity to take photos and enjoy the fall atmosphere.

4. Stay straight onto Davis Bridge Rd. (cross bridge)(0.2mi)

Turn left onto Davis Bridge Rd. (0.2mi)

Turn left onto Davis Bridge Rd. Exd. (0.2mi)

Turn Left onto Kelpytown Rd. (0.4mi)

Turn right at first cross street and turn right onto NY-12N (1.1mi))

Constable Hall

The Federal style limestone building was built in the early 1800's by William Constable, Jr., and was completed in 1819.

In 1949 it was restored as a house museum and opened to the public for tours and event use.

It has become a community favorite and a tourist attraction.

The museum is currently closed due to COVID - but you are welcome to tour the grounds and garden. Here you will find great photo opportunities, with the gardens and the fall foliage as a background!

Steak N' Brew


Steak 'N Brew is a well known local restaurant that offers a number of selections including beef, pork, duck, chicken, seafood, and dessert.

Whetstone Gulf State Park is built in and around a three-milelong gorge cut into the eastern edge of the Tug Hill Plateau. The gorge is one of the most spectacular scenic vistas east of the Rocky Mountains, which makes it a perfect scenic stop for leaf peeping!

The fantastic fall colors are perfect over the gorge.

Whether you go on the gorge trail or simply talk a walk around the community area the foliage is sure to be stunning!

Why do the leaves change color?

Leaves are made up of three main pigments which appear as colors in leaves.

The first and most important pigment is chlorophyll which helps trees use sunlight to create food. it also appears as the color green in leaves and overshadows the orther pigments.

The second pigment that appears in leaves is carotenoid which appears as the color yellow, orange, and brown.

The third pigment that appears in leaves in anthocynins which appears at the color red.

In autumn sunlight decreases and the leaves respond by producing less chlrophyll. When the trees decrease their chlorophyll the decreased amout of chlorophyll allows the other pigments to appear creating colors such as yellow, orange, red, and brown in the leaves.
